

Gerda journeys through the seasons searching for him, meeting the Queens of the other seasons, Spring, Summer and Fall, along the way. With the help of Bae the reindeer she finds Cei in the north and unfreezes his heart. She overcomes the Snow Queen with the warmth in her heart returning balance to the seasons. Gerda and Cei return home closer friends than they were before.

Anna Fin, Director

Anna, who was born in Russia and grew up in Toronto, has worked and trained as an actor in theatre and film after graduating from the European Theatre Institute in Berlin, Germany in 2004. She joined RTC in 2014 as an actor, then came on board as one of three co-directors, and acting coach of 'Dog Sees God - Confessions of a Teenage Blockhead' by Bert Royal; a controversial and daring performance that received rave reviews for its eye-opening impact on the community. She is in the director's seat again this season, this time bringing a show for all ages to the stage - a fairy tale. Anna has long been fascinated by the simple yet profound wisdom and beauty that folklore and fairy tales provide to people of all ages. She is honoured to be working with such a talented cast of actors - ranging in age from 13 to 70+ - plus an exceptionally dedicated and talented crew. In other news, Anna is also honoured to have won the Best Actress Award at the Zone Theatre Festival 2014 for her portrayal of Gus in RTC's production of Harold Pinter's "The Dumb Waiter."



Martin Ralph, Production Stage Manager

Martin has been active in the community theatre scene in Revelstoke since the early 80's. He is Vice-Chair of RTC where he has contributed in all areas of production, most notably as a director and stage manager, and has won awards for his technical and artistic work. Recent credits include 'Boy's Play', 'Dog Sees God', 'Dear Santa', 'Fuel', 'It's On, It's Off', 'Mending Fences' and musicals such as 'The Sound of Music', 'Chicago', among many. Martin's passion is working with young adults and new actors who want to expand their horizons and look at life's canvas from a different angle.


Robber Woman


Daffodil

On the eve of her twenty-fifth birthday, Catherine, a troubled young woman, has spent years caring for her brilliant but unstable father, a famous mathematician. Now, following his death, she must deal with her own volatile emotions; the arrival of her estranged sister, Claire; and the attentions of Hal, a former student of her father's who hopes to find valuable work in the 103 notebooks that her father left behind. Over the long weekend that follows, a burgeoning romance and the discovery of a mysterious notebook draw Catherine into the most difficult problem of all: How much of her father's madness - or genius - will she inherit? Proof won the 2001 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and Tony Award for Best Play.

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
